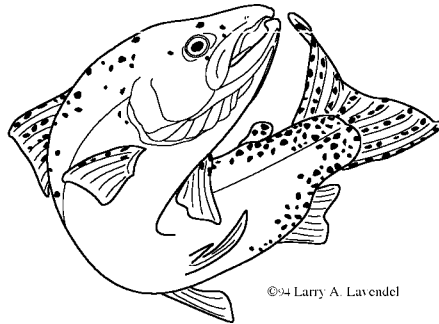

Environmental Education Center Plans Move Forward

We have made a great deal of progress in our plans for the Environmental Education Center. Earlier this year the Friends of San Leandro Creek assumed the lease on a 1,300 square foot building located at 777 Alvarado Street on the south bank of San Leandro Creek. We have worked closely with our architect Todd Jersey, who has produced detailed prints for the renovation of this building.

This project would not be possible with the participation of several important partners.

Alameda County Public Works has supported this project from its earliest days, and has committed funds for a major creek bank restoration and stabilization project adjacent to the Center.

The Alameda County Waste Management Authority has provided financial backing to assist with the "green" portion of the design for the renovation, as well as

additional support in price preferences for recycled content and sustainable material purchases.

The City of San Leandro's Redevelopment Agency partners this project with the provision of lease payments for the property. The City also assisted with the cost of the schematic redesign for the Center's present location.

We are currently in discussions with **Pacific Gas and Electric** regarding sponsorship of energy efficient components of the project, including solar collection panels.

East Bay Municipal Utility District has expressed interest in providing elements of the gardening infrastructure, including the cistern, water filtration and drip systems and possibly a living machine.

We continue to reach out to develop additional partners for this project. We are seeking the support of government agencies, foundations and "Friends" like you to enable us to bring this project to fruition!

We've just mailed an invitation to over sixty local schools to take advantage of our Watershed Awareness Education programs. The Friends host field trips to Root Park in downtown San Leandro, easily accessible from public transportation. Program components include: watershed awareness, local history, water quality testing, mural and creek tours and environmental stewardship.

For those students who can't get to the Creek our Watershed Awareness Coordinator will visit classrooms with a presentation of the San Leandro Creek Watershed Interactive CD-ROM. Each classroom that participates in our Watershed Awareness Education programs receives a free copy of the CD-ROM for the classroom library.

We encourage educators to build on these opportunities by having students participate in our annual Watershed Festival. We invite K-12 students to submit entries to our annual Watershed Contests. Prizes

will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each category (art, photography and writing) by grade levels (K-2, 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12). We also host class table displays so classes can prepare a Service Learning Project to present at the San Leandro Creek Watershed Festival Saturday April 24, 2004.
